What to do if you are worried that you might have coronavirus

You can also call CareVio directly and speak with a health care professional about your concerns at 302-320-5600 or 1-844-227-3565.

What NOT to do

Most people who are experiencing coronavirus symptoms do not need to go to the emergency department.

Please do not go to the emergency department unless you are experiencing symptoms that are severe or life threatening. If you have a medical emergency, please call 911.

If you are concerned you have coronavirus, please do NOT show up at your doctor's office. Instead, please call your doctor and ask if it is appropriate for you to keep or make an appointment and get instructions from your doctor.

These steps help to protect your safety and the safety of others.

If you need care, we are here for you. CareVio services remain open seven days a week and ready to provide support and guidance during these challenging times.
