#### CALLED TO ORDER - DIRECTOR CADE, OMB

Director Cade called the meeting to order at 2:03 p.m.

## **APPROVAL OF MINUTES – DIRECTOR CADE, OMB**

A MOTION was made by Secretary Magarik and seconded by Secretary DeMatteis to approve the minutes from the September 19, 2022, meeting of the State Employee Benefits Committee. MOTION ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY

#### DIRECTOR'S REPORT – DIRECTOR FAITH RENTZ, DHR, SBO

The Subcommittees met on October 20, 2022 to review Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 planning and analyzed options along with follow-up requests from the September Subcommittee meeting. The Subcommittee discussed ways to reduce health care cost, prescription drug cost and to consider evaluating direct and reference-based contracting. Further discussion will occur with the Subcommittees in November, and recommendations will be brought to the SEBC in early 2023 for consideration for the July 1, 2023 plan year.

#### FINANCIAL UPDATE – MR. CHRIS GIOVANNELLO, WTW

#### August Fund Report

Premium contributions were below budget. August was a rebate month and commercial prescription drug rebates were at budget at \$16.3M and Employer Group Waiver Plan (EGWP) rebates were below budget at \$11.3M. Claims ran high at \$8.8M over budget which brings total YTD claims for FY23 at \$17.5M over budget.

Director Cade asked if the cause of the high claims was due to the fact that more services are now available then they were at the start of the pandemic. Mr. Giovannello stated that utilization patterns are changing, and many services are getting back to normal use. Many services that were not available during the pandemic are now becoming accessible and there is a pattern of increased health issues due to these services not being available. Secretary Magarik confirmed that they are seeing a rise in more serious health issues and it's costing more to provide care because of the severity.

August had a net income of \$3.5M with a fund equity balance of \$141M.

Director Cade pointed out that August is a unique month due to the rebates that the fund received and asked about the frequency of these rebates. Mr. Giovannello stated that rebates are received quarterly, and four rebate payments will be expected for FY23. Mr. Giovannello also noted that last year (FY22), there was an extra rebate payment.

Chief Justice Seitz and Evelyn Nestlerode will not be participating in the Executive Session.

#### **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

A MOTION to move into Executive Session was made by Secretary Magarik and seconded by Controller General Ruth Ann Jones at 2:16 p.m. MOTION ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY.

The PUBLIC SESSION resumed at 3:20 p.m.

*Lieutenant Governor Bethany Hall-Long arrived to the meeting. Treasurer Collen Davis arrived to the meeting.* 

#### APPROVAL OF THE EXTENSION OF SPECIAL MEDICFILL WITH AND WITHOUT PRESCRIPTION

A MOTION was made by Secretary DeMatteis and seconded by Mr. Taschner to approve the extension of the Special Medicfill with and without Prescription plans for up to 12 months in accordance with Delaware Code Title 29 Section 6907, Emergency Procedures Act, and the critical need for professional services. During these 12 months, pending the resolution of the ligation, the SEBC will consider options to renegotiate the Medicare Advantage contract or rebid the State's Medicare health care plan.

Chief Justice Seitz is abstaining from voting.

MOTION FOR DISCUSSION. No Discussion.

MOTION ADOPTED. 8 approvals and 1 abstention.

#### MEDICARE SPECIAL MEDICFILL WITH AND WITHOUT PRESCRIPTION PLAN RATES

Mr. Giovannello reviewed the Medicare Special Medicfill plans rates effective January 1, 2023.

Secretary DeMatteis stated that these plan rates are the same rates that are presently in effect for the current plan year, however, these rates remain more costly than the Medicare Advantage plan. Director Cade asked to explain the impact on pensioners regarding the move to continue with the Special Medicfill plan. Secretary DeMatteis stated that 2,500-3,000 pensioners will be affected by not moving to Medicare Advantage by paying a higher cost for the Special Medicfill plan. Pensioners could pay as much as \$459.38 with the Special Medicfill plan but would only pay \$216.00 with the Medicare Advantage plan. An additional 480 pensioners enrolled in the Special Medicfill plan without prescription and who signed up for the Medicare Advantage plan will have to be contacted to determine if they want to continue coverage with the State's Special Medicfill plan.

The Statewide Benefits Office is preparing a letter to be mailed out to Medicare pensioners explaining the changes to the Medicare health care plan. The cost to the GHIP to continue with the Special Medicfill plan for calendar year 2023 is \$6.8M to \$7.5M a month.

# APPROVAL OF MEDICARE SPECIAL MEDICFILL WITH AND WITHOUT PRESCRIPTION PLAN RATES EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2023

A MOTION was made by Secretary DeMatteis and seconded by Mr. Taschner to approve the Medicare Special Medicfill with and without Prescription plan rates effective January 1, 2023.

MOTION FOR DISCUSSION No Discussion.

MOTION ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY.

#### **OTHER BUSINESS**

No new business was presented.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

Several organizations, GHIP retirees, and State pensioners expressed their concerns over the decision to implement a Medicare Advantage plan for Medicare benefit eligible retirees. These parties expressed concerns with the plan design and coverage, denial rates for prior authorizations, referrals, contract performance guarantees, and not receiving proper care. GHIP Medicare eligible members pensioners would like to be more involved with the health care planning process by having more representation on the Committee and offered considerations for future health care planning. Pensioners also applauded the SEBC on extending the Special Medicfill with and without prescription plans for calendar year 2023.

#### ADJOURNMENT

A MOTION was made by Secretary DeMatteis and seconded by Chief Justice Seitz to adjourn the public session at 4:09 p.m. MOTION ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY.
