CALLED TO ORDER – LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR BETHANY HALL-LONG

Lieutenant Governor Hall-Long called the meeting to order at 1:05 P.M.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES - LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR BETHANY HALL-LONG

A MOTION was made by Wayne Emsley and seconded by Representative Baumbach to approve the minutes from the Retiree Healthcare Benefits Advisory Subcommittee meeting on August 24, 2023. MOTION ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY.

DISCUSSION OF GOALS AND RECOMMENDATIONS ON UPCOMING RFP - SECRETARY DEMATTEIS, DHR

Secretary DeMatteis provided Subcommittee members with details for the upcoming request for proposal (RFP) for an Employer Sponsored Medicare Supplement Plan. A contract award will be made to one bidder for an initial term of two years with a one-year optional renewal which aligns to the contract term for the non-Medicare health care plans.

The Subcommittee continued a discussion on the details of the upcoming Medicare RFP.

Senator Townsend stepped out of the meeting.

DISCUSSION OF GOALS FOR NON-GRANDFATHERED MEDICARE-AGE FUTURE RETIREES – REPRESENTATIVE PAUL BAUMBACH

Representative Baumbach presented an option for non-grandfathered Medicare age future retirees which included modeling two Medicare supplement plans around Medigap plans G and L. The chart included a cost analysis of the 10th, 50th, and 90th percentiles and by years of state service.

DISCUSSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS ON OCTOBER 1 STATUS REPOPRT – LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR BETHANY HALL-LONG

Subcommittee members had a discussion on the October 1 Status Report and provided feedback on recommendations of the content for the report.

A discussion occurred around creating a permanent Subcommittee that is dedicated to analyzing non-Medicare and Medicare retiree healthcare benefits and healthcare pricing in Delaware.

Kristin Short reviewed the proposed draft report outline for Subcommittee members. Subcommittee members will be provided a draft copy of the report and any proposed edits will be discussed at the September 27, 2023 meeting.

DISCUSSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS – COMBINATIONS OF OPEB FUNDING, ELIGIBILITY, AND PLAN DESIGN FOR MODELING – JOANNA ADAMS, OPEN

A MOTION was made by Wayne Emsley and seconded by Bill Oberle to recommend removing from consideration in its remaining work the following options to reduce the OPEB liability:

- Move to HRA/Individual Marketplace, with 2% annual indexing of HRA
- Move to HRA/Individual Marketplace, with 4% annual indexing of HRA
- Offer a Medicare Advantage Plan similar to the formerly proposed Highmark BCBS Delaware Freedom Blue PPO
- Offer a choice between a Medigap Supplement Plan similar to existing Special Medicfill Plan or a Medicare Advantage Plan similar to the formerly proposed Highmark BCBS Delaware Freedom Blue PPO

Abstentions – Director Cade, Secretary Geisenberger, Secretary DeMatteis. MOTION ADOPTED.

Joanna Adams continued to review combinations of options to reduce the OPEB liability.

Jeff Taschner presented a document on increasing the OEC rate incrementally by 0.25% and 0.50%.

A MOTION was made by Jeff Taschner and seconded by Wayne Emsley to recommend beginning with the FY25 budget, continuing to contribute to OPEB prefunding with the funds generated by SB175 and the two Other Employment Costs to fund current retiree health insurance costs (PayGo) and prefund future retiree

healthcare (OPEB fund). In addition, increase the OPEB prefunding to 0.50% of payroll. The prefund amount will then increase by an additional 0.25% of payroll each fiscal year thereafter from such funding sources as the General Assembly may determine. The total of all three sources of funding will not exceed the annual required contribution for the OPEB fund.

Subcommittee members discussed the motion, and no vote took place.

Senator Townsend stepped back into the meeting.

A MOTION was made by Jeff Taschner and seconded by Bill Oberle to table to previous motion. MOTION ADOPTED.

RHBAS WORK PLAN - LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR BETHANY HALL-LONG

The next meeting has been changed and will now be held on September 27, 2023 from 1:30-4:00 with a physical location at the Delaware Department of Insurance building.

RHBAS DISCUSSION AND OTHER BUSINESS

Secretary Geisenberger notified Subcommittee members that the 1% of budget from last year and this year has been added to the OPEB trust fund. Additionally, another \$101M was deposited to the OPEB fund with the funds coming from excess revenue.

Subcommittee members had a discussion on the pre-65 retiree healthcare population.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Members of the public provided comment on agenda items at today's meeting and addressed continued concerns over future retiree healthcare coverage. A member of public provided comment on Health Reimbursement Accounts (HRAs).
